

PRESCRIPTION MEDICINES DURING COVID-19 OUTBREAK

It is important to make sure your child takes their medicine every day. To treat asthma, ADHD, and other conditions, many children take a daily prescription medicine. During the COVID-19 outbreak, it is important that you have enough of your child's prescription medicines at home for them to take every day.

The Ohio Department of Medicaid and Managed Care Plans of CareSource, Buckeye, Molina, and United Healthcare have made special changes to make sure you can get your child's prescription medicines during the COVID-19 outbreak:

- Early refills
- 90-day supplies for eligible prescription medicines

PRESCRIPTION HOME DELIVERY

Many pharmacies offer free or low cost prescription home delivery. You should contact your local pharmacy directly to ask about and schedule home delivery. Here are some questions you might want to ask your local pharmacy:

- Is there an extra fee for delivery?
- Which medications can be delivered?
- Can refrigerated items be delivered? Can diabetes supplies be delivered?
- Can the delivery include dosing spoons/syringes for liquid medications?
- When can I expect the delivery?
- Do I need to be home when the medication is delivered to sign for it?
- How much advance notice is needed to set up a delivery? Are same day deliveries available?

CURBSIDE PHARMACY PICK-UP

Many pharmacies now offer free prescription curbside pick-up services. This service allows patients to go to their local pharmacy, park in a specific spot at the pharmacy, and have prescriptions brought to them while waiting in their car. You should contact your local pharmacy directly to ask about curbside prescription medicine pick-up.
