REDUCED COST PHARMACY PROGRAMS

Low cost medications are available at these pharmacies in Franklin County

About these programs: All of these pharmacies require a doctor's prescription. Ask your doctor if any generic drugs can meet your health needs. Check with the store pharmacy nearest you for more details about the store's program. Here are the costs as of Feb. 2023.

CVS Willing to find discount prescription coupons. Have ExtraCare Rewards program that can save on

prescriptions.

Giant Eagle Provides savings on pet prescriptions.

Kroger Accepts a number of prescription discount cards.

Meijer's Free selected antibiotics and pre-natal vitamins. Blood glucose testing for \$4, and free testing for blood

pressure, BMI, and diabetes risk assessment. Pet prescriptions go towards mPerks for future pharmacy

discounts.

Sam's Club Available for Plus Card Members, \$4 for a 30 day supply for generic medication. Free select generic

medications.

Target (CVS) Utilizes discount prescription coupons. **Walgreens** Free shipping on prescription refills.

Wal-Mart \$4 for a 30-day supply and \$10 for a 90-day supply for limited medications.

Costco Pharmacy - Costco Member Prescription Program

About the program: Prescription discount card that provides discounts over Costco's regular prices for those with or without insurance for certain medications, medical devices, and vaccines.

To qualify: Must be a Costco member. A member's pets and dependents under 18 can also be included in the program.

How to use: Members just present their Costco card at the pharmacy and request the CMPP price. Can be used at all Costco pharmacies and some additional local pharmacies.

DISCOUNT CARDS

Franklin County Prescription Discount Card

About the program: Franklin County makes the free prescription drug discount cards available under a program sponsored by the National Association of Counties (NACo). Card holders can save up to 80% on generics and 40% on name brand prescription medications. Participants can also save on diabetes supplies, dental care, eye care and eye wear and hearing aids. Cards are available at all public buildings, including libraries, county buildings and senior centers or can be requested online. These can be used by all Franklin County residents, regardless of age, income or existing health coverage. They are accepted at most pharmacies. A national network of participating retail pharmacies also honors the card. Most helpful to those with no prescription coverage.

Good Rx

About the program: Prescription discount program that allows participants to compare prices of different medications through their mobile app and receive discounts on medication with their discount card. Accepted at many area pharmacies. Discounts can only be applied for prescriptions used off insurance. Anyone can qualify regardless of whether they have insurance or no insurance.

MAIL ORDER GENERIC MEDICATION PROGRAM

Rx Outreach

About the program: This is a nationwide program. It provides help with purchasing a list of 300 generic and some brand name medications at a reasonable cost—prices vary. It also helps with diabetes supplies. Medicines are mailed directly to you. No insurance is accepted.

You qualify if:

- You are a US citizen or legal resident
- You have an income less than 400% of federal poverty level.

EXPANDED MEDICAID

To qualify for MBIWD, a person must:

- Be 16 to 64 years old
- Be disabled as per the Social Security Administration or as determined by Ohio Medicaid or eligible under the MBIWD medically improved category
- Be employed in paid work (includes part-time and full-time work)
- Pay a premium (if applicable)
- Meet certain basic requirement found here: https://medicaid.ohio.gov/families-and-individuals/coverage/who-qualifies

You must also meet these financial requirements:

Have a monthly income less than or equal to 250% of the federal poverty level (\$2,831 for one person, \$3,814 for a two person household, \$4,797 for three person household, and so on)*
