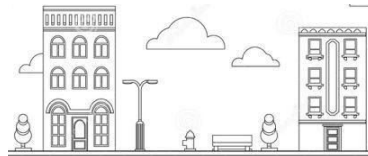


HOUSING RESOURCES

HOMEBASE

Homebase offers services including eviction prevention, public benefits assistance, emergency rental assistance, relocation resources, and short-term financial assistance.

Homebase Eligibility:	How to apply and what to bring to the appointment:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If you are in immediate risk of entering the shelter system • If you have received an eviction notice or are at risk of eviction • If you want to remain stably housed in your community 	<p><i>Proof of identity and income:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identification for adult household members • Proof of income and employment for working household members • Cash assistance budget letter/WMS; SSI/SSD award letter <p><i>Proof of living situation:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copy of lease or written rental agreement • Rental assistance referral/certificate/voucher • Rental demand, landlord letter or court documents (eviction papers, marshal's notice, lease) • Light, gas, and telephone bills

NYC HOUSING CONNECT

Affordable Housing is available through the Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) with the Housing Connect Program

You do not have to be a resident of NYC to apply, but apartments will be offered to people that are residents of the city first

Affordable Housing Eligibility:	How to Apply:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• You need affordable housing• Your family income is below the income limits on the following website: www1.nyc.gov/site/hpd/renters/income-guide.page• Your credit, background, and housing court history meet the development standards• You have a social security number or individual taxpayer identification number	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Apply. Browse apartments online and apply, here: www1.nyc.gov/site/hpd/index.page <i>*You may also send an application through the mail*</i> Do not apply online and on paper. You will be disqualified to enter the lottery.2. Interview. If your application is selected, you will be invited to an interview with agents from the building. An interview may be set within 2-10 months<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Get your documents ready. Find a list of what you should bring in this link https://a806-housingconnect.nyc.gov/nyclottery/instructionPDFs/After_You_Apply_en.pdf3. If you are eligible, you may be offered the choice to sign a lease or be placed on a waiting list.4. For any questions, call 311 and ask for the Affordable Housing Hotline.

HOUSING RESOURCES

NYC HOUSING AUTHORITY (NYCHA)

***Affordable housing is available through NYCHA.** You do not have to be a resident of NYC to apply, but apartments will be offered to people that are residents of the city first*

Affordable Housing Eligibility:	How to Apply:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• You need affordable housing• Your family income is below the income limits on the following website: www1.nyc.gov/site/nycha/eligibility/eligibility.page• At least one member of your household is a U.S. citizen or non-citizen with eligible immigration status (e.g. permanent resident, refugee/asylum status).	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Apply online at https://apply.nycha.info/ or apply in-person at one of their walk-in centers that can be found at www1.nyc.gov/site/nycha/about/contact.page2. You will receive a letter from NYCHA within 60 days assigning you a housing priority.3. If you are eligible, you will be placed on a waiting list for an eligibility interview.4. For any questions, call 718-707-7771 from 8am-5pm Mon-Fri.5. Remember, you MUST renew your application every 24 months.

The waiting time for a place in a NYCHA house may be as long as 7 years

METROPOLITAN COUNCIL ON HOUSING

MCH provides information on tenant rights, rent guidelines, rent control/stabilization, repairs from negligent homeowners, adequate heat and hot water, eviction threats, pests, and housing court. For answers to your questions call their hotline or go to their walk-in clinic.
