<p><b>Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)</b>            Provides NYC youth between the ages of 14 to 24 years with paid summer employment for up to six weeks. The program provides participants with occupational skills training, employment services, and educational opportunities. <p><b>Work, Learn &amp; Grow Employment Program</b>            A twenty-five week, school-year employment program open to SYEP who are currently in school and between the ages of 16 to 21 years. Participants receive focused work readiness training and work up to 10 hours a week. <p><b>NYC Ladders for Leaders</b>            A twenty-five week, school-year employment program open to SYEP who are currently in school and between the ages of 16 to 21 years.
