# **UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (UI)**

For workers who have lost their jobs at no fault of their own and are ready, willing, and actively looking for work.

# **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

- Social Security Number, Driver's License or Motor Vehicle ID number, Alien Registration Card Number
- Names, addresses, phone numbers of all employers of the last 18 months
- Employer Registration or Federal Employer Identification Number
- If you were a federal employee: copies of SF8 and SF50 forms
- Military: Most recent separation form DD 214
- NY.GOV account. Sign up for one at <u>labor.ny.gov/signin</u>

#### **BEFORE YOU APPLY**

- You must be searching and ready for work, and willing to attend meetings at your closest Labor Department Office to qualify for benefits. If you work part-time you may be able to claim benefits (partial UI)
- UI offers a <u>maximum of 26 weeks of benefits</u>, with no exceptions. If you're still unemployed at the end of the benefit year, you can file another claim to see if you're eligible
- Once employed, all days worked must be reported when claiming weekly benefits, even if not paid yet
- If you work more than 30 hours or earn more than \$504 in a week, you will not be eligible for benefits

### **AFTER YOU APPLY**

Once a claim is filed, it takes **three to six weeks** to receive your first payment to ensure your application has been reviewed and processed. You will not receive benefits during this time period.

# During this time you should:

- Complete and return questionnaires and phone calls <u>from the Department of Labor</u>
- Continue to claim weekly benefits if you are unemployed and meet the eligibility requirements

If you are eligible, <u>you will receive any back weeks of benefits owed with your first payment</u>. If found ineligible, you will receive a determination explaining the reason.
