The School District of Philadelphia's **Opportunity Network** aims to provide students who have previously dropped out (or those in-school and at risk of dropping out) with the chance to return to school through an "educational pathway." These pathways are designed to assist students in earning their high school diploma and preparing for a successful postsecondary experiences.



What multiple pathways program options are available?

DUAL ENROLLMENT

GATEWAY TO COLLEGE is located on the main campus of Community College of Philadelphia. It is a dual enrollment program that allows students who have dropped out of school the opportunity to earn their high school diploma and college credits simultaneously.

Interested students must:

- Be between the ages of 16-21.
- Have the ability to complete requirements for graduation before or during the year of their 22nd birthday.
- Have no more than 21 academic high school credits.
- Demonstrate reading ability at an 8th grade level or higher.
- Live in Philadelphia.
- Attend an orientation session at CCP and complete an application.

EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS PROGRAM (EOP)

(formerly Twilight) allows students 17 years of age or older to continue earning credits towards a high school diploma. Classes are held at four locations from 3:15 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. or 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Participants can earn 6 or more credits each year.

Interested students must:

- Be 17 years of age or older (no upper age limit).
- Have at least 8 high school credits prior to Enrolling.
- Not be enrolled in a regular day school.

Interested students must:

- Be between the ages of 15-21.
- Be at least two years behind in school.
- Have earned 13.5 or fewer high school credits.
