Target Population: Families residing in North Philadelphia, preference given to families residing in PHA.

- Families living in or near 19121,19122,19129,19132,19133, 19140 zip codes: Eligible
- Families that do not reside in PHA: Eligible
- Children ages 16 months 2 years old & children that will turn three after September 1st*: <u>Eligible</u>
- Families that qualify for free and reduced lunch: Eligible

Target Population: Latino and African Immigrant Families residing in South/Southwest Philadelphia.

- Latino and African Immigrant families living in or near 19139, 19142, 19143, 19145, 19146, 19147, 19148 and 19153 zip codes: <u>Eligible</u>. (Families can be English speaking but must be immigrant)
- Children ages 16 months 2 years old & children that will turn three after September 1st*: <u>Eligible</u>
- Families that qualify for free and reduced lunch: Eligible
- Undocumented families: Eligible

- Children ages 16 months 2 years old & children that will turn three after September 1st*: Eligible

Parent-Child Home Program

The Parent-Child Home Program (PCHP) provides critical, intensive early literacy, school readiness supports to prepare underserved children for school and life success. PCHP works with families with children 16 months old to 4 years of age by providing trained community-based Early Learning Specialists, who are linguistic and cultural matches with families, and who model reading, play, and conversation activities for parents and children together. The Program provides twice-weekly home visits, a minimum of 92 visits over the two-year program cycle and 46 books and educational toys, which are curricular items for each family, to build language, literacy and learning-rich home environments. PCHP also connects families to other needed supports, including housing, medical and educational services. All PCHP graduates are assisted in enrolling in high-quality preschool programs. Research shows that 84% of children who participate in PCHP as two and three-year-olds graduate from high school.

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
